COUNCIL WORKSHOP

- **A. Staff Updates** The following items are not planned for discussion at the workshop, unless specifically requested by Council.
 - I. Alcohol Beverage License Chipotle Mexican

Chipotle Mexican Grill, located at 3186 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road, has applied for an on-premise consumption license for distilled spirits to supplement their existing beer license. Ms. Leslie Ratelle is the licensee. The Business Services department recommends approval. Consideration of this item will be included on the <u>February 27 regular agenda</u>.

2. Capital Budget Adjustments

Staff has prepared recommended adjustments to the capital budget. Approval of these adjustments will be included on the <u>February 27 consent agenda</u>, unless Council prefers otherwise.

3. FY 19 Budget Schedule

The proposed schedule for preparation and adoption of the FY 19 budget will be presented. Special workshops will be held on April 25 and May 2.

4. Probation Contract Addendum

The Georgia Department of Community Supervision has reviewed the City's existing contract with PPS for probation supervision and required that we modify the contract's period of service. PPS has prepared a contract addendum that complies with the request. Approval of this addendum will be included on the <u>February 27 consent agenda</u>, unless Council prefers otherwise.

5. Facilities and Parks Asset Management & Maintenance Plan

The City has released bids for a consultant to update the existing facilities maintenance plan. Bids are due on February 19. Staff anticipates being able to recommend a consultant by the <u>February 27 regular agenda</u>.

C. RZ-2018-001 – Owner: Suwanee First Baptist Church. Applicant: Spartan Investors I, LLC. The applicant requests a rezoning from R-100 (Residential Single Family District) to RM-6 (Residential Multi-Family District) to allow for townhomes. The site is located in Land Lot 237 of the 7th District at 641 Eva Kennedy Road.

The Planning Commission recommended denial.

D. RZ-2018-002 – Owner/Applicant: Old Town Suwanee Partners, LLC. The applicant requests a rezoning from IRD (Infill Residential District) to IRD (change of conditions) to allow for the construction and renovation of detached single family homes. Site contains approximately 2.4 acres in Land Lot 237 of the 7th District and includes all of the block surrounded by Scales Street, Scales Road, and Jackson Street.

The Planning Commission recommended approval with conditions.

The class will kick off March 3-4 with the retreat to be held at City Hall.
