### **1. Approve Revised Probation Contract with PPS**

Legislative mandates require some minor administrative amendments to our existing probation contract with PPS, scheduled for renewal this month. A draft contract has been prepared that complies with these requirements and does not include any substantive changes to the services provided by PPS.

### **2. Approve Revised Contract with Gwinnett Urgent Care**

The City has a contract with Gwinnett Urgent Care for medical services related to worker's compensation cases. Staff has negotiated some revised rates.
