10. Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful Proclamation

Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful has launched their annual "Take the Pledge" campaign. The City has prepared a proclamation showing Suwanee's support.

II. Consider Narcan Purchase & Usage Policies

The municipal police departments have been working with the Gwinnett County Fire Department to develop a protocol for the police departments to purchase and use Narcan when interacting with a person believed to be experiencing an opioid overdose. The City must execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the County to implement this program.

12. Consider Revised Gaming Machine Ordinance

The City adopted a gaming machine ordinance in 2010. It contained a typo regarding a reference to the State Code. Staff has corrected the typo and recommends re-adopting.

13. Consider Contract for Sidewalk Projects
