# COUNCIL WORKSHOP BIG SPLASH ROOM

- **A. Staff Updates Agenda:** The following items are not planned for discussion at the workshop, unless specifically requested by Council.
  - I. Downtown Development Revolving Loan Fund

The DDA is evaluating a program administered through the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) called the Downtown Development Revolving Loan Fund (DD RLF). It is designed to assist cities, counties, and development authorities in their efforts to revitalize and enhance downtown areas by providing below-market rate financing to fund capital projects in core historic downtown areas. The maximum loan amount is \$250,000 per project. The Deming's approached the City about applying for the funds to assist with the Pierce's Corner project. Staff determined that it would be best for the DDA to consider the application. The first step is to complete an Initial Project Assessment (IPA). This does not constitute a submission of a DD RLF application and is not a guarantee or commitment of any kind. This is done so that DCA can have information in order to provide advice about the project's eligibility and competitiveness for funding. The DDA is in the process of completing the IPA. # 2. Annual Contract Approvals

## 3. Public Hearing for FY 2014 Occupation Taxes

Georgia law states that for any year that revenue generated from occupational taxes is proposed to be greater than the preceding year's revenue, a public hearing must be held. While staff is still processing FY 13 occupation taxes, it appears we will meet this threshold with a slight increase in revenues. If so, a public hearing on FY 14 occupation taxes will be scheduled for June 25<sup>th</sup>.

#### **B.** CIP Updates

#### I. Hotel May Queen Demolition

Preliminary work on the demolition is underway, with a targeted completion date of September.

# 2. Cemetery Improvements

Preliminary work is underway to fill depressed grave sites and mark graves at the Jackson Street and Shadowbrook cemeteries.

#### 3. PIB Medians

Russell Landscape Group is underway with work to accommodate the additional plantings. Delivery and installation of the first materials is expected for the week of June 10<sup>th</sup>.

#### 4. Town Center Park Irrigation Well

As of June  $4^{th}$ , the well pump and piping has been installed and the system can pump water. The next step to make the system fully functional is to finish setting up the SCADA system controls. This contractor is expected on-site June 10th to begin this process.

#### 5. Suwanee Creek Park Disc Golf Course

One of the short-term projects in the 2010 Park Enhancements Implementation Plan is a disc golf (Frisbee golf) course at Suwanee Creek Park. Staff is currently negotiating a design and construction contract with landscape architect Sean Murphy, who has prepared a draft concept plan for the course. Design work is anticipated to begin in July and staff anticipates that the Public Works department will

be able to do the construction, with a tentative substantial completion date at the end of 2013.

# 6. Buford Highway Sidewalks

Staff will provide an overview of a recent meeting with the Ruby Forest HOA on this project.

## C. Peoples Bank & Trust Agreement

Peoples Bank & Trust has requested that the City consider entering into the Demand Deposit Marketplace program to assist them with collateralization requirements of the City funds. Gregory Jay has reviewed the agreement and does not have any issues with us proceeding with the program. Staff will provide more details at the workshop.
