a. Ratify Vehicle Purchases

The State of Georgia bids certain items, such as vehicles, for statewide purposes, which allows municipalities and other jurisdictions to take advantage of the accomplished competitive bidding process. The Public Works and Police departments have purchased some vehicles through this state contract. The purchase of these vehicles were all approved in the FY12 budget, but the purchase must be approved by the City Council, per the City's purchasing policies.

b. Adopt Revised Park Ordinance

The recently adopted Service Delivery Strategy (SDS) provides for the Suwanee Police to have authority in George Pierce Park, a Gwinnett County park. The City's park ordinances need to be revised in order to reflect this change. Staff has prepared a draft version of the revised ordinance.

c. Approve Resolution Authorizing Special Event Alcohol Policy Changes

Staff is working on some revisions to the Alcohol Beverage ordinance. Some of these changes are related to special events and other revisions are changes affecting the overall ordinance. Due to the timing of some upcoming events, staff is presenting these separately; the first revision has been prepared as a resolution.
