





Good2Give Celebration

Highlights Suwanee's 'Art for All' Campaign

The Community Foundation of Northeast Georgia chose the City of Suwanee's 'Art for All' capital campaign as one of the highlighted nonprofits at this year's Good2Give Celebration on Saturday, August 17.

"Good2Give is all about celebrating how much good we do when we work together. Each year we choose five different nonprofits and highlight the incredible impact they are having in our community," Redner said. "We also recognize the donors, volunteers and community who help make their work possible."

The city's first-ever capital campaign for public art, 'Art for All' seeks to raise \$1.25 million in private contributions to support the inclusion of three new public art pieces in the Town Center Park Expansion. The annual gala hosted 700 philanthropic Gwinnettians and

brought additional awareness to the campaign.



"While Suwanee provides the infrastructure of new parks and green spaces, it is the support of private citizens and businesses that provides the public art that has played such a significant role in what Suwanee does, what Suwanee is, and how Suwanee is viewed," said Assistant City Manager Denise Brinson. "With the help of our businesses and citizens, we will continue to elevate the role of public art and the impact of artistic engagement in our community."


Out to Brunch

'Brunch Bill' to be included on November Ballot

A referendum authorizing the City of Suwanee to permit and regulate Sunday sales of alcohol by the drink from 11 am to 12:30 pm will be included on the ballot for this November's municipal election. Better known as the "Brunch Bill" or "Mimosa Mandate," passed through the Georgia legislature in 2018, giving local governments the opportunity to call referendums if they so choose.

The Gwinnett Board of Commissioners voted in December 2018 to amend the county's alcohol ordinance, which covers only restaurants in unincorporated parts of the county, leaving the cities to hold their own referendums on the topic.

Voting for this referendum will take place on Tuesday, November 5, 2019. Since this is a municipal election, voting will occur at Suwanee City Hall.

Geekspace Gwinnett Offers Makerspace for Technologically-Savvy Creatives

Do you like to tinker with technology? Are you wild about welding? Have knack for knitting? Or ever had an interest in these areas, but no idea where to start?

Geekspace Gwinnett is a nonprofit makerspace located in the heart of Suwanee that promotes creativity, tinkering, and technology. Geekspace is home to makers with shared interests, especially in computing or technology, who gather to work on projects while sharing ideas, equipment, and knowledge.

Geekspace partnered with the City of Suwanee in the endeavor. The city maintains a corporate membership that allows staff access to their facility and resources and provides support to the organization. In return, the geeks at Geekspace use their talents to enhance certain city events, such as the Suwanee Fest Parade and Glow in the Park.

"Working on Glow in the Park brought so much joy to our organization," said Steve Smith, president of Geekspace Gwinnett. "Our members really came together to collaborate and teach each other new skills to build the lanterns, from conception to completion."

Geekspace offers a variety of programs and classes for its members. Skill building workshops cover a vast array of topics, such as woodworking, electronics, CNC routing, laser cutting, 3D printing, sewing, and costume design. They offer their talents to local high school robotics teams and STEM programs, and young creatives can participate in the Lego League.

"My favorite thing about Geekspace is the random nature of everything that goes on here," said Smith. "One time I came in and found people melting aluminum with

fire. I said, 'You can do that?!' and they responded, 'We can do anything!""

Connected Vehicle Technology in Gwinnett County

The Gwinnett Department of Transportation, in partnership with Georgia Tech, is planning to deploy technology intended to increase functionality, improve safety, and reduce congestion in the Peachtree Industrial Boulevard corridor. This technology is called Connected Vehicle. Connected Vehicle Technology allows vehicles including cars, fire trucks, and freight trucks to interact with infrastructure such as traffic lights in order to increase the safety and efficiency of traffic in the area.

Deputy Director of Gwinnett County Transportation, Tom Sever, believes "connected vehicle technology is the next step in providing safer roadways for all drivers, reducing emergency vehicle response times, and making traffic flow smoother."

How does this impact you?

The Connected Vehicle Technology Study will not affect you or your commute initially, but the results of the study have the potential to change traffic for the better. Peachtree Industrial Boulevard is one of the primary corridors for the Connected Vehicles Study. Georgia Tech researchers are studying the impact the connected vehicle technology has on reducing response time for emergency vehicles on Peachtree Industrial Boulevard. Essentially, the emergency vehicles will "communicate" with traffic lights so the lights change to allow the safest and quickest path for emergency vehicles to move through intersections. The Gwinnett Department of Transportation will be installing the technology over the next 18 months and is expected to be fully implemented in 2020.

Connected Vehicle Technology Across the United States

Similar Connected Vehicle studies are currently underway in cities across the country, including New York and Tampa, with studies planned for Los Angeles, San Francisco, Pittsburgh, Denver, and Orlando, to name a few. The US Department of Transportation hopes the technology will increase efficiency of traffic flow from freight to emergency response vehicles and eventually at pedestrian crosswalks. Ultimately this technology will make the roadways safer and travel smoother.

SUWANEE POLICE

SPECIAL RESPONSE TEAM

The Suwanee Police Department recently developed a brand-new force called the Special Response Team (SRT). Commanded by Lieutenant Dwayne Black, this specialized team of eight officers deals specifically with high risk crimes, handling search and arrest warrants, and undercover operations. Most recently, the unit has seen success in preventing internet crimes against children, reducing drug activity and burglaries in the area, and handling barricaded suspects.

Entry into the Special Response Team requires passing a physical agility test and achieving a 90 percent or greater score on the firing range. Thanks to these high qualification standards, as well as intense training, the SRT has a 100 percent safety record for the arrests and crimes they have handled so far. Not a single officer or suspect has been harmed in the line of duty.

"The Special Response Team has greatly increased the ability and reach of the Suwanee Police Department in terms of enforcing the law," said Corporal Chance Belcher, a member of the SRT.


The City of Lilburn also has an active Special Response Team, allowing Suwanee SRT members to train and work with the Lilburn members. If the Suwanee SRT needed additional specially-trained police to respond to a situation in Suwanee, Lilburn would send their SRT to assist. More city SRTs will have the opportunity to be a part of this reciprocal arrangement as the program develops.
