A. Call to Order

Mayor Burnette called the meeting to order at 6:37 P.M., and read the procedures for Public Hearings for the record.

B. Public Hearing

1. Apple Lounge Alcohol Beverage License

Apple Lounge, located at 3103-A Lawrenceville Suwanee Road, has applied for a new license for the on-premise consumption of beer, wine, and distilled spirits. Ms. Barrera has applied to be the licensee and the Business Services department recommends approval.

The applicant, Catherine Barrera, 3103 Lawrenceville-Suwanee Road, Suwanee, GA, was present. There was no opposition.

2. SUP-2019-002 - The applicant requests a Special Use Permit to allow for an automotive related use within the C-2 (General Commercial District) zoning district. The site is located at 3550 Lawrenceville-Suwanee Road.

Josh Campbell, Planning Director, provided the staff analysis as follows: The applicant requests a special use permit to allow a vinyl vehicle wrapping business at 3500 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road, Suite 103. The property is zoned C-2. The use is consistent with the Future Land Use Map. Staff and the Planning Commission recommend approval with conditions.

- 7. The American Cancer Society will host the <u>Bark for Life</u> on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>November</u> 9th at 9am. The event is a noncompetitive walk for dogs and their owners to raise
