






Nucleus






This artist loves animals—his previous SculpTour piece, 'Corey' (a horse), was purchased by a local business and is on display at The Terraces at Suwanee Gateway.






The artist likes to create art using recycled materials. List some of the different parts that you see!






Apollo is the Greek god of the sun, knowledge, healing, music and dance, archery, and protection of young. Why do you think the artist named this piece after Apollo?








Kinetic Flower Sculpture by Al Garnto of Blairsville, GA

See the statue's left hand? It's signing "I love you"... What do you think this man's name is? Who is he saying "I love you" to?








Over the years, Mel and his family and friends have appeared in Mellow Mushroom restaurants, calendars, and even in their own comic strip.


