A. Call to Order

Mayor Burnette called the meeting to order at 6:37 P.M., and read the procedures for Public Hearings for the record.

B. Public Hearing

1. RZ-2016-002 – Owner: Gwinnett Prado, LP. Applicant: Lennar Georgia, Inc. The applicant requests a rezoning from C-3 (Special Commercial District) to PMUD (Planned Mixed Use Development) to allow for development of townhomes. The site is located in Land Lot 238 of the 7th District on McGinnis Ferry Road east of the intersection with Peachtree Industrial Boulevard and contains approximately 12.52 acres.

Josh Campbell, Planning Director, presented the staff analysis as follows: The applicant is proposing 97 townhomes near the intersection of Peachtree Industrial Boulevard. The surrounding area is commercial zoning with commercial uses.

Staff and P&Z recommended approval of the request. Should Council desire to approve this request, it is recommended that Council approve with P & Z conditions dated July $1,\,2016$

• Matt Reeves, Anderson Tate & Carr, One Sugarloaf Center, 1960 Satellite Boulevard, represented the applicant. Mr. Reeves stated the applicant is in agreement with the conditions dated July 1, 2016.

This property is at a major intersection in the City. If this site were a commercial parcel it would have been commercial by now. By rezoning the property to townhomes, it will take the parcel off the apartment list and give a shot in the arm to vacant commercial locations. This is a high quality product aimed at professionals.

The site is proposed for pocket parks and greenspace.
