#### A. Call to Order

Mayor Burnette called the meeting to order at 6:33 P.M.

#### **B.** Announcements

- 1. Join us this <u>Friday, May 27<sup>th</sup></u> for our annual <u>Red, White, Bluegrass & Bach</u> concert to kick off the Memorial Day weekend. All eyes will be to the sky at 7:00 p.m. as the Fort Benning <u>Silver Wings</u> parachute into Town Center (weather permitting). The National Anthem will be performed at 7:15 p.m., followed by a classical performance by the <u>Main Street Symphony</u> an adult amateur orchestra associated with Huthmakers Violins. At 8:30 p.m., <u>bluegrass band Sideline</u> will take the stage.
- **2.** You have a few days left to take part in the beloved Suwanee tradition, our annual finders-keepers, month-long **Art on a Limb** program. Two pieces of original artwork are hidden each day; those who find a piece of art get to keep it. Look (and listen!) for wind chimes along the <u>Suwanee Creek Greenway as well as Sims</u>

<u>Lake and White Street</u> parks throughout the month of May. For this year's program, artist Judy Isaak fashioned clay double bell wind chimes.

- **4.** We're excited to announce that the brand-new **Brushy Creek Greenway** is now open! An approximately one-half mile multi-use trail that connects Suwanee Dam Road at Delay Road to Stonecypher Road near Main Street, Brushy Creek Greenway is a combination of concrete and boardwalk following the Brushy Creek corridor. The shade, combined with shorter distance, makes the Greenway ideal for treks with younger children particularly since it connects to PlayTown Suwanee and the library.
- **5.** We're now accepting applications for the popular <u>Citizens Police Academy</u>. #### I. Consider Abandoning White Lane Right-of-Way

The existing right-of-way on White Lane is proposed to be abandoned in association with the recently approved development.

Motion by Councilmember Goodman to abandon White Lane Right-of-Way, second by Councilmember Hilscher and so carried 4-0.

# J. Consider Approving Resolution to Refinance the Parks & Open Space Bonds

It appears there is an opportunity to refinance the City's series 2006 General Obligation bonds used for parks and open space with an outstanding balance of approximately \$12.2 million. In order to proceed, the Council must adopt a Parameter's Resolution.

Gregory Jay, City Attorney, stated Council is being asked to pass a number of items to include: Bond Ordinance, Bond Purchase Agreement and the Escrow Deposit Agreement which contains a rate lock.

Motion by Councilmember Ireland to approve the Resolution to Refinance the Parks & Open space Bonds to include the Bond Ordinance, Bond Purchase Agreement and the Escrow Deposit Agreement which contains a term sheet rate lock, second by Councilmember Hilscher and so carried 4-0.

# K. Consider Award of Contract to Amaysing Services, Inc. in an Amount Not to Exceed \$61,960.00 to Construct a Pier at Sims Lake Park

The City has received bids to construct a covered pier on the lake at Sims Lake Park. Staff recommends awarding this contract to Amaysing Services, Inc. of Gainesville. This was one of the projects identified in the City's 2010 Park Enhancements study.

Motion by Councilmember Hilscher to award contract to Amaysing Services not to exceed \$61,960.00 to construct a pier at Sims Lake, second by Councilmember Goodman and so carried 4-0.

# 1. Approve GEMA Mutual Aid Agreement

The City must renew the Intergovernmental Agreement with the Georgia Emergency Management Agency (GEMA) that establishes procedures and other ground rules for counties and cities that help one another during natural disasters. The agreement was last executed in 2012.

This is an agreement with the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police (GACP) to conduct a promotional assessment center for managerial positions (Corporal/Sergeant) to fill current vacancies. Funds are budgeted.
