1. Call to Order

Mayor Burnette called the meeting to order at 6:32 P.M.

2. Public Hearing on FY 2016 Budget, 2016-2020 Capital Improvement Program, and FY 16 Occupation Taxes

This is the second public hearing for the FY 16 budget and 2016-2020 CIP. Additionally, Georgia law states that for any year that revenue generated from occupational taxes is proposed to be greater than the preceding year's revenue, a public hearing must be held. We anticipate meeting this threshold for FY 16 revenues.

Marty Allen, City Manager, presented a PowerPoint highlighting the FY 2016 budget. Copies of the PowerPoint were made available for attendees. The first workshop was in April, the second was in May, and the Budget has been available for public review since May 27th.

Audience Comment:

Richard Trice, 4021 McGinnis Ferry Road, Suwanee, GA. Mr. Trice stated this is a
lovely document. He expressed concerns regarding the new Administrative Assistant
position, money for Arbor Day, funding for the November Election, and funding for
Downtown building lease. He stated the City needs to focus on paying down the
debt.

9. Consider Adoption of the FY 2016 Budget and 2016-2020 Capital Improvement Program

Motion by Councilmember Foster to adopt the FY 2016 Budget and 2016-2020 Capital Improvement Program, second by Councilmember Miller and so carried 6-0.

10. Consider Adoption of Revised Water Resources Ordinance

The City must update the Water Resources section of the Code of Ordinances for compliance with Georgia EPD requirements.

Motion by Councilmember Goodman to adopt the Revised Water Resources Ordinance, second by Mayor Pro Tempore Hilscher and so carried 6-0.

11. Consider Sidewalk Design/Build Contract with Peach State Construction

Staff recommends awarding a contract to Peach State Construction for the design and construction of sidewalk and pedestrian improvement projects at Suwanee Dam Road and Peachtree Industrial Boulevard.

Motion by Councilmember Foster to enter a contract with the construction firm, Peach State Construction, of Covington Georgia, for complete design and construction of a sidewalk on Peachtree Industrial Boulevard from Grand Vista Approach to McGinnis Ferry Road, and a sidewalk on Suwanee Dam Road from Brinsworth Drive to Moore Road, for a fee in an amount not to exceed \$658,150.00 for 5 foot wide concrete sidewalks along Suwanee Dam Road and Peachtree Industrial Boulevard, second by Councilmember Ireland and so carried 6-0.

12. Consider Design Contract with Clark Patterson Lee for Smithtown Road Sidewalks
Clark Patterson Lee has recently completed some concept and cost estimate work for
sidewalks to be constructed on Smithtown Road. Staff recommends awarding the full design
contract to Clark Patterson Lee.

Motion by Councilmember Goodman to enter a contract with the engineering firm, Clark Patterson Lee, of Suwanee, for Phase 2 design (Field survey, Complete Design Documents, Right of Way Plans and Acquisition, Required permits, preparation of bid documents, and construction administration) of sidewalks on Smithtown Road, for a fee in an amount not to exceed \$248,400, second by Councilmember Miller and so carried 6-0.

13. Consider Contract with Custom Sign Factory for Wayfinding Signs

The City originally awarded a contract in the fall for the fabrication and installation of the wayfinding signs. This contract was recently terminated. Staff has met with the second bidder, Custom Sign Factory, and recommends entering into contract to complete the project.

Motion by Mayor Pro Tempore Hilscher to authorize the Mayor to enter a contract with the Custom Sign Factory of Duluth, Georgia, in an amount not to exceed \$49,624.00, second by Councilmember Ireland and so carried 6-0.

14. Consider Resolution Establishing Qualifying Dates for November Election

The Council must adopt a resolution establishing the dates of qualification for the November election.

Motion by Councilmember Foster to adopt the Resolution Establishing Qualifying Dates for the November Election (August 31 – September 2, 2015), second by Councilmember Goodman and so carried 6-0.

a. Authorize Staff to Apply for the LMIG Street Resurfacing Program Staff has proposed a list of 2.48 miles of City streets to submit as part of the LMIG resurfacing project.

The City's contract with Professional Probation Services (PPS) is also up for renewal at the end of the fiscal year. There have been some changes to state law that take effect July 1 and impact the services provided by PPS that were outlined in the original contract. As such, staff recommends adopting a new contract with PPS.

d. Authorize Mayor to Execute Agreement for Participation in Gwinnett County CDBG Program

The City participates in the Gwinnett Urban County Community Development Block Grant Program. The County must requalify for this program every three years and the City must execute a FFY 2016-2018 Cooperation Agreement.

e. Approve 4th Quarter FY 15 Budget Adjustments
