City Council Informal Session

Informal discussion among City Councilmembers and staff. Food provided for Elected Officials and staff. No action to be taken during session.

6:30 P.M. COUNCIL MEETING COUNCIL CHAMBERS

1. Call to Order – *No recording due to technical difficulties.* Mayor Burnette called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

2. Public Hearing

a. SUP-2015-003 – Owner: 1495 Buford Highway Associates, LLC. Applicant: Karina Miller. The applicant requests a special use permit to allow for outdoor boarding. The site is located at 1495 Buford Highway and contains approximately 1.36 acres

Josh Campbell, Planning Director, presented the staff analysis as follows: The applicant requests a Special Use Permit to add a fenced-in outdoor boarding area to her business, pet boarding and grooming, at 1495 Buford Highway in the commercial portion of Baxley Point planned mixed use neighborhood. The applicant occupied suite 110 in the commercial building for four years and recently moved to suit 140, which has direct access to to the proposed outdoor boarding area. Animal daycares

with boarding are permitted in the C-2A zoning district. The applicant plans to provide an outdoor run for dogs three times a day.

The Special Use Permit process was created by the City Council in 2001 to better handle certain land uses. The Special Use Permit process allows the Council to review certain proposals in the context of their use and take into consideration the surrounding area and other relevant factors. A Special Use Permit does not change the underlying zoning of property, but grants the property an additional specified use.

The Planning Department recommended approval. The Planning Commission recommended approval with conditions.

Support – No one spoke in support of the request.

Opposition

- Amy Snyder, 1796 Baxley Point Trace expressed concern for the impact this business will have on property values.
- Deborah Varcella, 2725 Baxley Point (HOA President), expressed concern for safety of the dogs.

Councilmember Miller requested Mr. Campbell to clarify the conditions. Mr. Campbell stated there is a condition that regulates times for the dogs to be outside 3 times a day at 30 minute intervals during regular business hours. The dogs are to always be supervised.

b. Village Grove On-Street Parking

Josh Campbell, Planning Director presented the staff analysis as follows: A developer is proposing to construct 12 homes along Village Grove Drive. The property was rezoned last year per RZ-2014-009 with a condition of zoning that required the property owner to petition for regulation of on-street parking along Village Grove Drive. The property owner/developer has completed the required application and petition.

Support

• Chris Yoder, 920 Cotton Mill Place. Mr. Yoder stated he is in favor or the Ordinance.

Opposition

• Jim McGregor, 4398 Village Field Place, expressed concern about parking in the cut outs and traffic navigation along the roadway in the subdivision.

Councilmember Foster stated this item addresses parking along a specific section in the subdivision and suggested Mr. McGregor take advantage of the Petition process through the Planning Department for traffic issues in the subdivision.

Tim O'Brien, 4857 Gather Place, stated he understands no parking signs he is concerned about enforcement.
 Mr. Campbell stated this will become an Ordinance of the City and enforced by the Police Department.

3. Announcements

a. Strut your Mutt at the Georgia SPCA 5th Annual Run for the Rescues 5K, Fun Run and Festival to benefit homeless pets on Saturday, March 28. The fun run begins at 8:30 am and the 5K race at 9:15.

In addition to the race, the <u>festival will last from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm</u>. Enjoy food and beverage, arts and crafts, inflatables for the kids and treats for dogs, cats and runners alike. Between 12pm and 2pm, the Dog Authority will be demonstrating some <u>dog tricks</u> with rescue dogs. The Georgia SPCA will hold <u>pet contests</u> for categories such as Longest Tail, Longest Ears, Pet that looks like owner, Best Trick, Tallest Dog, and Shortest Dog. Many local rescues will be there with <u>dogs for adoption</u>.

- **b.** Vendor applications for Suwanee's <u>Farmers Market</u> are due <u>Monday, March 30</u>. Vendors who have been part of the Suwanee Farmers Market for less than two years are required to attend the annual meeting that evening at 7 p.m. in City Hall. The <u>market will open for the season on Saturday, May 2</u> in Town Center Park. The market will be held every Saturday from 8am until noon through October 3.
- c. Be sure to join us on <u>Friday</u>, <u>April 3rd</u> as we kick off <u>Food Truck Fridays</u> for the season. The trucks will be in Town Center Park from <u>5:30-9:30 pm</u>. Trucks expected in April include: Atlanta Chamos Grill; Down The Bayou Cajun Cuisine; Food Movement; Freckled and Blue; Happy Belly; Mac the Cheese; On Tapa the World; Tasting Maine; and Yolis Street Food. We'll host food trucks six times through the season, on the first Friday of the months.
- **d.** We're calling designers of all ages to create the 2015 <u>Suwanee Fest theme logo</u>. The competition is open to professional and amateur designers and entries may be handdrawn or computer-generated. The <u>winning creator will receive \$500</u> and bragging rights on the logo, which will be used on official festival t-shirts and marketing posters. <u>The deadline for submission is Friday, May 1</u>. See suwanee.com for more details. Suwanee Fest will be September 19th and 20th this year.

The funding status for the project has not changed, but completing this step will move the project one step closer to being "shovel ready."
