Informal discussion among City Councilmembers and staff. Food provided for Elected Officials and staff. No action to be taken during session.

1. Call to Order

Mayor Burnette called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M and read the procedures for Public Meetings for the record.

2. Public Hearing

a) Alcohol Beverage License Request: Hurricane Grill & Wings, 340 Town Center Avenue, Suite A-8

Mr. Michael Dravo has applied for a license to serve beer, wine, and distilled spirits at Hurricane Grill & Wings. The Business Services Department recommends approval. The applicant, Mr. Dravo, 8740 Glasgow Point, Duluth, GA was present. There was no additional audience comment.

b) RZ 2014-007 - The applicant requests a rezoning from R-100 and R-140 to PMUD to allow for a planned mixed use development of single family attached and detached units. The site is located in Land Lot 211 of the 7th District on the east side of Martin Farm Road and contains 31.39 acres

Staff recommends approval with conditions. The Planning Commission postponed this item for one month.

Opposition: Mr. Mark Hughes stated he has lived on Martin Farm Road for over 20 years. He is concerned the development will cause a major traffic problem. In addition, he stated there is already a flooding issue in the area, the homes will increase the amount of concrete in the area and will cause additional flooding. He would be open to a smaller development (maybe 15 houses).

There was no additional comment.

c) RZ 2014-008 - The applicant requests a rezoning from C-2 and C-2A to RM-8 to allow for a multi-family residential development. The site is located in Land Lots 169 and 170 of the 7th District along Sawmill Drive near Lawrenceville Suwanee Road and contains approximately 29.29 acres

Staff recommends denial. The Planning Commission postponed this item for one month. Mr. Campbell stated there was an error in the survey which has been addressed.

There was no audience comment.

3. Announcements

- a) The City is holding a <u>Public Information Open House</u> for the <u>Buford Highway</u> <u>Reconstruction</u> Project at City Hall on Thursday, October 9 from 5 PM to 7:30 <u>PM.</u> The Concept Plan will be available for review and input from the public during this meeting. City staff, GDOT officials and consultant representatives will be present during the open house.
- b) The City is now accepting applications for the fall session of our popular <u>Citizen</u> <u>Police Academy</u>. The Police Department offers this <u>nine-week program</u> to help strengthen the bond of friendship and cooperation among citizens and police officers. Topics covered include crime scene processing, traffic stops, building searches, crime prevention, and narcotics identification. Classes will be held from 6:30-9 p.m. weekly <u>beginning October 7</u>. Registration is free, but notarized applications must be received by <u>September 26</u>. - c) Suwanee's final <u>Food Truck Friday</u> of 2014 will be held at Town Center Park on <u>October 3</u>. Food truck vendors expected to be on site include The Blaxican, Freckled and Blue, The Fry Guys, Hail Caesar, Mighty Meatballs, A Moveable Feast, Nana G's Chicken and Waffles, Tex's Tacos, and WOW! Food will be served from <u>5:30-9:30 p.m.</u> with music beginning at 7 p.m.

d) We're proud to announce that we have recently received several <u>awards</u> from a variety of state, national, and international organizations.

The City's <u>Comprehensive Annual Financial Report</u> was recognized for <u>Excellence in Financial Reporting</u> recognition from the <u>Government Finance</u> <u>Officers Association</u>. This was the third consecutive year that the City's annual report earned such recognition, but it is the first time that the publication received a grade of A from the panel of judges. The 2013 annual report was written and designed by City of Suwanee staff.

One of the City's annual events, <u>Woofstock</u>, co-sponsored with Star 94 radio, received a <u>Georgia Downtown Conference Award of Excellence</u> in August. The City was also recognized in the promotions category with a silver award.

Finally, the City was recognized last week for its <u>performance management</u> efforts with a <u>Certificate of Distinction from the International City/County</u> <u>Management Association's (ICMA) Center for Performance Analytics</u>. Suwanee is among <u>11 jurisdictions nationwide</u> to receive the Certificate of Distinction and one of two in Georgia recognized overall.

12. Consider Adopting a Resolution of Commitment for the City's 2015 LCI Transportation Funding Application for the Suwanee Avenue Connector
The Atlanta Regional Commission has announced the availability of Livable Centers
Initiative (LCI) Transportation Implementation Funds to be awarded in 2015. Applications
must accompany a resolution of support from the Mayor and City Council. The City will
apply for approximately \$3,000,000 to apply to the Suwanee Avenue connector project, with
a 20% local match of approximately \$600,000.

Motion to adopt the Resolution by Councilmember Goodman, second by Councilmember Ireland and so carried 6-0.

Marty Allen, City Manager, explained this is a project that has been on the books for some time. This will provide connectivity between Suwanee Avenue at Town Center to the King Street area. This is an application to apply for grant funding for this project.

13. Consider Authorizing the Mayor to Execute Contract with Allied Paving Contractors, Inc., in the Amount of \$622,831.12 for Patching and Resurfacing of 2.76 miles of Various City Streets

The City has released a bid for the resurfacing of approximately 2.76 miles of City streets and recommends awarding to the low bidder, Allied Paving Contractors, Inc. of Pendergrass, GA.

Motion by Councilmember Ireland to authorize the Mayor to execute a contract with Allied Paving Contractors, Inc., in the amount of \$622,831.12 for Patching and Resurfacing of 2.76 miles of various city streets, second by Councilmember Goodman and so carried 6-0.
