#### A. Call to Order

Mayor Burnette called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. and read the procedures for Public Hearings for the record.

#### **B.** Public Hearing

1. Alcohol Beverage License: Suwanee Neighborhood Sports Bar and Grill, 105 Horizon Drive

Suwanee Neighborhood Sports Bar and Grill has applied for an alcohol beverage license. The Finance Department has reviewed the application and recommends approval. The applicant, Lucinda Patel, was present for the hearing. There was no audience comment.

2. RZ-2013-004 – Owner: Jeffrey Smith and Dennis Lane. Applicant: Ultrapure Properties. The applicant requests annexation and rezoning from M-1 (Unincorporated Gwinnett County, Light Industry District) to M-1 (City of Suwanee, Light Industry District) to allow for an existing industrial

### building. The site is located in Land Lot 253 of the 7th District at 325 Brogdon Road and contains approximately 1.83 acres

Josh Campbell, Planning Director, presented the staff analysis as follows: This rezoning is being proposed to rezone the property from Gwinnett County M-1 to M-1 in the City of Suwanee. The site has a 14,000 sq. ft. building with no development proposed at this time. This will eliminate an unincorporated island between the City of Suwanee and the City of Sugar Hill. Staff recommended approval. P&Z voted 3-0 to recommend approval. There was no audience comment.

The Public Hearing was closed with a 5 minute recess.

From 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Saturday, January 4, volunteers will be on hand to assist with tree disposal and to provide free seed packets.

# N. Consider Authorizing the Mayor to Execute a Contract with URS Corporation for Professional Design and Construction Administration Services for the Buford Highway Reconstruction Project

The City received five responses to the RFQ for professional design and construction administration services. A committee reviewed the proposals and interviewed two teams of consultants on December 3. The selection committee recommends awarding this contract to URS Corporation of Atlanta.

#### O. Consider Adopting Ordinance to Permit Home Brew Special Events

During this past legislative session, the state legislature passed HB 99 which permits home-

brew special events upon adoption of local legislation. A model local ordinance has been drafted and reviewed by Legislative Counsel and the state Department of Revenue.

# P. Consider Authorizing the Mayor to Approve Change Order #1 in the Amount of \$20,465.50 with Astra Companies for the Buford Highway Sidewalk Construction Project

This project consists of the construction of a 5' wide sidewalk from the entrance to George Pierce Park north along the east side of Buford Highway to North Dollar Circle (connecting to the existing sidewalk in front of Park Pointe) and then north to connect to the existing sidewalk on Ruby Forest Parkway. The change order addresses some needed design and construction modifications due to site conditions.
