F. Consider Authorizing Mayor to Execute a Quit Claim Deed for Blue Grass Trail

Lenzol Alvarez has requested that the City convey approximately 449 square feet of property on Blue Grass Trail that abuts his property. The City Attorney recommends conveying this through a Quit Claim Deed.

G. Consider Declaring 3670 Windsor Park Drive as Surplus Property

The City has fully transitioned to the new Public Works facility on Swiftwater Park Drive. In accordance with OCGA 36-37-6, the City Council must declare this property as surplus in order to dispose of it through a sale.

H. Consider Contract with ARC

The City was awarded \$160,000 to complete a study of potential projects for the Pedestrian and Bicycle Plan Update. To receive the funds, the City must enter into a contract with the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC), which administers the funds.

I. Consider Memorandum of Understanding for the Elder Abuse Task Force

The Gwinnett District Attorney has submitted an administrative request for the cities to sign a Memorandum of Understanding and participate in a task force to prevent elder abuse.

1. Adopt Updated Hazard Mitigation Plan

In order to remain eligible for FEMA grant funding, Gwinnett County must update its Hazard Mitigation Plan every five years. The cities are included in the County's plan.

2. Approve Memorandum of Agreement with Gwinnett County Water Resources

Gwinnett County Water Resources department monitors, collects, and provides data for the cities to submit to Georgia EPD for their respective annual stormwater reports. The County has developed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) related to these activities.

3. Adopt Updated Procurement Policy for FHWA Funding

In order to be recertified by GDOT to be eligible for FHWA funds, the City needs to update our current procurement policy for projects with FHWA funding.

4. Authorize the Mayor to Execute an Agreement with Motorola for the Police Communications Software System

This agreement with Motorola provides updates to the police communications software system and locks the price in for a ten-year period. The agreement will be for one year with successive one-year terms which renew automatically over the next ten years.
