



As the City of Suwanee's event planner, I am responsible for organizing events for Suwanee's citizens to enjoy. And it's more than just planning a fun party (although it's that, too!). I maintain

partnerships with vendors, order needed items, meet with city departments and downtown business owners to make sure they know what to expect, and oversee the set-up, execution, and cleanup of events.

Suwanee has had a long tradition of hosting events in Town Center Park! We host about 40 events every year. Some events are planned by the city and some events are

planned by others and just hosted in the park.

One of my favorite sayings is that I'm in the memorymaking business! I love to create events that people look forward to attending. Not only do we have fun events like movie nights, concerts, festivals, lantern parades, and pet events, we also host over 15 races a year for various nonprofit groups AND a yearround farmers market! Our goal is to make all of these events special and fun for citizens of all ages.

Suwanee Fest is the largest event that we have all year in the park. Over 50,000 people attend in twodays – that's DOUBLE the number of people who live in Suwanee! A committee works on this event for almost an entire year. We choose a theme, select vendors, plan a parade, order busses and tents, and review safety plans with police – and that's just a few items we handle BEFORE the festival even begins!

Being an event planner is a lot of fun. I get to work with a lot of people who help create the magic of events in our public works department, our police department, and people in city hall. We enjoy creating special memories with our events and we always want to show that Suwanee is a great place to live and have fun!






