<u>CITY COUNCIL MEETING</u> TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2021

A. Call to Order

Mayor Pro Tem Miller called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

B. Public Hearing

Mayor Pro Tem Miller read aloud the rules for Public Hearings.

1. Alcohol Beverage License for Mega Package, 2820 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road Joshua Kang applied for an Alcohol License for a retail package store (off-premise consumption) for the business located at 2820 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road. The Business Services Department recommends approval. There were no comments of support or opposition. There were no questions or comments from Council.

2. Alcohol Beverage License for Seaside Oyster Bar, 3890 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road Suite 1

Blake Rogers applied for an Alcohol License for Seaside Oyster Bar for the business located at 3890 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road Suite 1. The Business Services Department recommends approval. The applicant's representative, Ms. Jenny Germonsen, 3890 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road, spoke in support of the request. There were no questions or comments from Council.

3. AMD – 2021 – 001 Planned Park Neighborhood Overlay

A proposed amendment to the City of Suwanee Zoning Ordinance including Article V. Zoning District Development and Use Regulations, in order to add a special use, a Planned Residential Park Neighborhood in the R-140, R-100, R-75, IRD, RM-6, and RM-8 zoning districts, and regulations related to that special use, and other purposes. Josh Campbell gave an overview of this request.

Mayor Pro Tem Miller announced that 10 minutes per side would be devoted to public comment.

No one spoke in support of the request.

Speakers in opposition included:

Mr. Tom McConnell, 3795 Smithtown Road – Mr. McConnell expressed concerns regarding the impact of home values, traffic and infrastructure costs and noted that request contradicts the 2020, 2030, and 2040 comprehensive plans.

Mr. David Martinez, 3656 Suwanee Creek Road – Mr. Martinez cited discrepancies with the 2040 comprehensive plan in regard to the Smithtown Road character area and the Suwanee North character area, and cited the responsibility of Council per the Special Use Permit code.

Ms. Shelley Farr, 98 Timberlost Trail – Ms. Farr stated she and her neighbors researched the neighborhood and it's zoning prior to purchasing their homes and purchased with confidence knowing that the homes and surrounding neighbors had similar properties regarding land size and house size. She additionally stated that not everyone wants to live in an area similar to the Town Center Park residential property area.

Ms. Michael Farr, 98 Timberlost Trail – Ms. Farr stated that she emailed Council regarding her concern that based on the size of her property and the two properties next to her, a developer could potentially build 33 homes on these sites. She expressed concern regarding the amount of parking and traffic that would ensue on her street.

Mr. Van Schliestett, 1173 Bend Creek Trail – Mr. Schliestett expressed concern that seeing what he originally bought could potentially be destroyed. He suggested Council incorporate the protection for small parcel landowners verbiage from the 2030 comprehensive plan into the amendment.

Mr. Reed Wilson, 3367 Rising Fawn Trail – Mr. Wilson stated that a very large subdivision is currently being constructed behind his property that was misrepresented by the county to the surrounding homeowners. He would like city landowners to receive the respect they deserve.

After 10 minutes, Mayor Pro Tem Miller closed the Public Hearing.
