#### 2. 2010 Millage Rate

This is the second and final public hearing on the 2010 millage rate; the first was held on August 12. The City has advertised a proposed rate of 5.77 mills, which is the same rate as last year.

City Manager, Marty Allen, presented a PowerPoint presentation regarding the Millage Rate and stated the millage rate is proposed to be reduced to 5.70, due to the current tax digest from Gwinnett County. Councilmember Brooks asked if the recommendation takes into consideration the appeals. Mr. Allen stated that the appeals are an unknown, but based on the information a millage reduction is proposed.

#### **Audience Comment**

Mr. Jimmy Spiro, 895 Landover Crossing, Suwanee, GA. Mr. Spiro stated he has
posed his question several times without an answer. He stated the bond portion of the
tax bill is the only increase in the past 8 years. Why does this change every year?
 Why can't the bond be paid off? There was no additional audience comment.

### 3. Request for Change in Licensee for Alcohol Beverage License: Olde Towne Tavern & Grille, 340 Town Center Avenue

Olde Towne Tavern & Grill has applied for a change in licensee for its alcohol beverage licensee. The new licensee is Franklin G. Merriam. The finance department has reviewed the application and recommends approval.

Mayor Williams stated that the request results from the previous licensee no longer being associated with the restaurant. There was no audience comment and the Public Hearing concluded to restart at 7 P.M.

expire December 31, 2010. Mr. Peed currently serves as the Director of Fine Arts at the Wesleyan School.

Motion to appoint John Peed to fill the unexpired term of Alison Starnes by Councilmember Goodman, second by Mayor Pro Tem Brooks and so carried 6-0.

Mayor Williams recognized Ms. Scott, a Suwanee resident, for her work in Haiti. The audience viewed photos of this work in a video presentation. Mayor Williams presented Ms. Scott with a Proclamation acknowledging her contribution at home and abroad and proclaimed Wednesday, August 25, 2010 as Julie Scott Day.

#### 12. Consider Adoption of the 2010 Millage Rate

Motion by Councilmember Goodman to adopt the millage rate of 5.70 as recommended by staff, second by Councilmember Foster and so carried 6-0.

13. Consider Request for Change in Licensee for Alcohol Beverage License: Olde Towne Tavern & Grille, 340 Town Center Avenue

Motion to approve by Councilmember Burnette, second by Councilmember Goodman and so carried 6-0.

#### 14. Consider Adoption of Dynamic Driver Feedback "Radar" Sign Policy

The City's Short Term Work Program (STWP) recommends the installation of radar signs in strategic locations throughout the City. Funding for these signs has been planned for each of the next three years in the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP), proposed to come from the 2009 SPLOST program. The purpose of this policy is twofold: 1) to set goals and procedures guiding the location of signs identified by the City; and 2) to establish a procedure for citizens to initiate requests for installation of these signs.

Motion to adopt by Councilmember Foster, second by Councilmember McOmber and so carried 6-0.

### 15. Consider Authorizing the Mayor to Execute a Contract with Radarsign, LLC in the Amount of \$32,649.00 for the Installation of Radar Signs

The City released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the installation of radar signs. Two proposals were received. Staff has reviewed the proposals and recommends awarding the contract to Radarsign, LLC of Alpharetta in the amount of \$32,649.00. This will include the installation of five signs in the City: 1) Lawrenceville-Suwanee Road near

Suwanee Creek; 2) Smithtown Road between Leaf Lake Dr. and Timberlost Tr.; 3) Main Street near PlayTown Suwanee; 4) Settles Bridge Rd. between Barony Dr. and Short St.; and 5) McGinnis Ferry Rd. near McGinnis Reserve. This project is included in the Short Term Work Progam, with funding budgeted from the 2005 SPLOST program.

Motion to approve the contract with Radarsign, LLC in the amount of \$32,649.00 by Councilmember Goodman, second by Councilmember Foster and so carried 6-0.

## 16. Consider Authorizing the Staff to Negotiate a Contract with Advergents in an Amount Not to Exceed \$65,000.00 for the Installation of a Park Video Surveillance System and Authorizing the Mayor to Execute Said Contract

The City released an RFP for the installation of video surveillance cameras in the parks and along the Greenway. Staff proposes a staggered implementation of the cameras in order to test available technologies, with initial installation at George Pierce Park, along the Suwanee Creek Greenway, and in Suwanee Creek Park. Two proposals were received for this project. Staff has reviewed the proposals and would like to negotiate a contract to Advergents of Lawrenceville in an amount not to exceed \$65,000.00.

Motion to approve the contract with Advergents in an amount not to exceed \$60,000 by Mayor Pro Tem Brooks, second by Councilmember McOmber and so carried 6-0.

#### 17. Council Consent Agenda

#### a) Adoption of Updated Speed Zone Ordinance

Every three years the City must adopt an updated speed zone ordinance, which includes a list of streets and highways on which Police may use speed detection devices. The City's current list expires on December 31, 2010. Upon adoption by Council, this will be forwarded to the State Department of Public Safety for review and approval.

#### b) Approval of Adjustments to Downtown Manager Position

With the recent vacancy in this position, staff reviewed this position to determine if any adjustments need to be made prior to filling it. Staff recommends changing this to a full-time position, in addition to changing the title to Downtown and Business Development Manager.

### c) Adoption of Amended Soil Erosion, Sedimentation and Pollution Control Ordinance

The City adopted an amendment to the Soil Erosion, Sedimentation, and Pollution Control Ordinance in December 2009 and forwarded this to the State Environmental Protection Department (EPD) for review and acceptance. EPD has forwarded comments requesting revisions to the adopted ordinance. Staff has updated the ordinance accordingly.

#### d) Adoption of Urban Camping Ordinance

Staff recommends that Council consider adopting an urban camping ordinance, which would address people sleeping and living in parks, under bridges, and in other outdoor areas. Staff has worked with the City Attorney to prepare a draft ordinance, modeled after Norcross's ordinance.

Motion to approve the Consent Agenda by Councilmember Burnette, second by Councilmember Goodman and so carried 6-0.

#### 18. Executive Session: Legal, Personnel, and/or Real Estate Issues

Motion to ENTER Executive Session for Legal and Real Estate matter by Councilmember Foster, second by Mayor Pro Tem Brooks and so carried 6-0.
