Discussion: Potential Harvest Farm Garden Plot Expansion

Overview

Harvest Farm currently has 75 plots. We have the space and money to install 30 more plots, but we are not sure if we should expand. We do think that there is demand for more plots, as Suwanee is growing. However, there are also potential downsides to expanding, such as losing use of the current grassy greenspace.

The decision of whether or not to expand our community garden should be made after careful consideration of the potential benefits and drawbacks. We will need to weigh the potential benefits against the potential drawbacks and make a decision that is in the best interests of the garden and Suwanee.
