


PARKING & SHUTTLES



Do You Want to Build a Playground?

We're breaking ground on PlayTown Suwanee 2.0

Building upon the success of PlayTown Suwanee nearly 20 years ago, the city is excited to break ground on a new community-built playground on October 9-15!

After weeks of brainstorming, designing, reviewing, re-designing, and designing again, the City of Suwanee and PlayTown Committee unveiled the playground design in July. The design can currently be viewed at **Suwanee.com**.

Leathers & Associates - the designer and project management team behind the original community build - designed the playground after hosting interactive design sessions with classrooms in Suwanee elementary schools to gather ideas. The custom-designed playground will be at the same location, similarly sized, and include elements reminiscent and the character of the original. The design will meet modern standards and utilize from earth-friendly, recycled materials that are long lasting and virtually maintenance-free.

More than 1,000 community members helped build the original PlayTown Suwanee over a five-day period in 2004. The collective build experience offers a hands-on opportunity for citizens give something tangible back to their community, resulting in a beautifully constructed, unique expression of shared pride.

will you help create something amazing, you'll also meet some pretty cool people from your community.





EXPLORE GWINNETT AWARDS SUWANEE PUBLIC ARTS COMMISSION CREATIVITY FUND PROJECT GRANT



Explore Gwinnett has selected the City of Suwanee Public Arts Commission to receive a Gwinnett Creativity Fund (GCF) project grant to fund a mural on the side of the historic Pierce's Corner building in the heart of Old Town Suwanee.

The GCF provides financial support to arts and cultural organizations that boost Gwinnett County's economic development and further the community's diverse cultural scene through funding from Gwinnett County. Now in its fourth year, the GCF awarded nearly \$200,000 in grants to fund projects and operational grants in 2023, including:

- Suwanee Arts Center operating grant for renovation and expansion, and support for summer camps
- Suwanee Performing Arts project grant for Broadway in the Park
- African American Cultural & Arts Festival project grant for event

Local Cultural Assets **EVERETT MUSIC BARN**

NO FOOLSHAESS & NO DRINKING.

Those were the words of Ma Everett back in 1964 when her sons, Randall and Roger Everett, asked permission to have members of their bluegrass band over to the family home to record live music for a radio station talent contest. The recording turned into a weekly jam session, with family members singing and playing, and the living room audience growing every week. Nearly every Saturday evening since, Everett's Music Barn has hosted local musical talent and even welcomed some of the most famous bluegrass artists from all over the United States.

Though Randall, Roger, and Ma Everett have since passed away, the dream and the music continue each Saturday night beginning at 8 pm. The stage is open to all levels of talent for jam sessions.

SUWANEE NAMED

TOP 10 SUBURB IN U.S.

FOR 'MODERN LIFESTYLE'

According to a recent analysis by STORAGECafé, Suwanee is performing well in terms of walkable, versatile development patterns and is among the best suburbs in America for city-like living.

The study ranked Suwanee sixth out of over 900 suburbs around the 100 most populated cities in the US. The study considered criteria such as crime rates, prevalence of restaurants and shopping, housing affordability, median household income, and public school rankings, with extra points given to suburbs with sustainable, mixed-use development that caters to various demographics.

Suwanee excelled in the areas of education, residential, and business sectors, with 42 businesses for every 1,000 residents, according to the analysis. The study also highlighted Suwanee's vibrant Town Center, eclectic festivals, and extensive nearby trail system, including the Suwanee Creek Trail, a 4.5-mile paved path through the woods. Town Center Park's ongoing expansion, along with its cultural and entertainment amenities, were also highlighted.



The City of Suwanee began the new fiscal (budget) year on July 1, 2023 with a \$17.9 million balanced operating budget. This year's budget represents an eight percent increase in operating expenditures as compared to FY 2023 amended budget.

SUWANEE'S \$17.9 MILLION FY 2024 BUDGET INCLUDES:

- 120 full-time and 12 part-time positions, including four new full-time positions
- New benefit Peace Officers Annuity & Benefit
- 4.9 percent group health insurance renewal
- Public Works and Police electric vehicle transition, \$123,000
- Strategic Plan, \$120,000 (first half of a two year plan)
- Facilities and right-of-way maintenance program, \$530,000
- Capital funding, \$442,000

After analyzing the 2023 tax consolidation information provided by Gwinnett County, the City of Suwanee is adopted a budget that assumes that the millage rate remain at 4.93 mills, the same rate adopted by the city the past eleven years. This proposed millage rate of 4.93 is a rollback millage rate increase of .405 mills, an 8.95 percent increase in property taxes based on market value growth. Property taxes, one of the chief sources of revenue for the City, are collected based on the millage rate.

The Suwanee City Council adopted the millage rate for the new budget year at its regular August 22 meeting. The city held three public hearings at City Hall on August 10 at 5:30 pm, and August
