Yulkkong LLC dba Moo Bong Ri is a new restaurant that will be opening in May 2024. It will be located at 3255 Lawrenceville Suwanee Rd. Ste 1-20. The owner, Mr. Sanghun Shin, as well as the manager, Ms. Jeungah Kim, have applied to be the licensees for on-premise consumption of beer, wine and distilled spirits.

- I. Consider New Alcohol Beverage License Applicants: Mr. Sanghun Shin and Ms. Jeungah Kim for Yulkkong LLC dba Moo Bong Ri, 3255 Lawrenceville Suite Road, Suite 1-20
- J. Consider Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) Funding for the Suwanee Loop Trail
  The Atlanta Regional Commission is accepting applications for LCI transportation project funding.
  Applications are due May 5th. Requests are for projects greater than \$2 million. Staff recommends requesting funding for the Right-of-Way Acquisition and Construction Phases of the Suwanee Loop Trail Project that is currently in design. A resolution committing the City to a 20% match of funds granted is required for application.
- K. Consider 2024 Local Maintenance Intergovernmental Agreement (LMIG) Road Resurfacing Bid Award to Allied Paving \$393,275.00

  Pursuant to the bidding process for the 2024 LMIG Road Resurfacing project, staff recommends

awarding the bid to Allied Paving in the amount of \$393,275.00.

Consider Proceeding with Sidewalk Trip Hazard Removal Projects \$93,955.00 Continuing the city's sidewalk repair projects, subdivisions that are next for repairs are Baxley Point, McGinnis Reserve, Park Pointe, Shadowbrook, and Stonecypher. The city's contracted vendor, Georgia Safe Sidewalks, has submitted a scope of work with an estimated cost of \$93,955.00.
- M. Authorize the Mayor to Sign Mutual Aid Agreement with Gwinnett County for the Purposes of Extraterritorial Assistance, and Other Purposes

The Gwinnett County Sheriff's Office requires that a Mutual Aid Agreement be established with every Gwinnett city to facilitate the provision of extraterritorial assistance for law enforcement functions during assistance events, among other purposes. The city executed the last mutual aid agreement in February 2013. This new agreement will undergo automatic renewal on December 31, 2024, and will renew annually thereafter.
