H. GMA/Georgia Municipal Employees Benefit Systems (GMEBS) Restated Adoption Agreement

Staff received documents from GMA outlining consolidated changes to the Basic Plan Document for the Defined Benefit Plan managed by GMA/GMEBS. GMEBS has recently received a favorable determination letter from the IRS. Each employer using the GMEBS Plan is required to adopt the restated Adoption Agreement as part of the restatement process.

I. Identified Stormwater Projects - \$1,800,000

Continuing the city's stormwater repair projects, locations that are next for rehabilitation are 4800 & 4570 Settles Point Road, 4334 Silver Peak Parkway, 4270 & 4139 Lansfaire Terrace, 360 & 100 Ruby Forest Parkway, 4220 Ruby Forest Boulevard, 3969 Treemont Lane, 252 & 211 Saint Martin Drive, 1430 & 1510 Chattahoochee Run Drive, 3354 White Sands Way, 1039 Industrial Court, and 930 Landover Crossing. The city's contracted vendor, IPR, has submitted a scope of work with an estimated cost of \$1,800,000.

J. Supplemental Agreement with Thomas & Hutton for Suwanee Loop Trail Engineering

The city has a contract with Thomas & Hutton for the initial phase of engineering the Suwanee Loop Trail, with a maximum allowable cost of \$372,539. As part of this process, certain tasks originally planned for future phases need to be incorporated into the first phase, without any increase in the overall project cost. Consequently, a supplemental agreement for Task Order #1 is being proposed, which increases this task order amount by \$21,758, resulting in a revised total task order amount of \$394,297.
