**Call to Order**

Lisa Winton called the meeting to order at 6:12 p.m.

**Adoption of the Agenda**

Sean Mulligan moved to adopt the agenda as presented (Keith Nabb 2<sup>nd</sup>). Motion carried 5-0.

**Approval of Minutes**

Cherie Heringer moved to approve the March 13, 2019 and March 28, 2019 minutes as presented (Berney Kirkland 2<sup>nd</sup>). Motion carried 5-0.

**Developer Presentation**

Suwanee Village, a mixed-use development of 276 multi-family units and approximately 18,000 square feet of retail space, was represented by Ellen Proctor, Development Associate with Pollack Shores Real Estate Group. Ms. Proctor shared with the commission members that Pollack Shores has incorporated distinctive benches, landscaping, and feature walls, both exterior and interior, throughout the property. PAC members shared additional suggestions which Ms. Proctor will present to her company. Alyssa Durden offered the public art consultant services of Linc Weis.

**Project Updates**

- Capital Campaign – Toni Shrewsbury reported that just under \$270,000 has been pledged thus far with appointments continuing to be scheduled.
- SculpTour 2019 – Toni shared that contracts have gone out to the participating artists and installations are being scheduled for the weeks of May 20 through May 24, 2019 and May 27 through May 31, 2019. She further shared that Al Garnto has completed his kinetic piece and will be sending photos later in the week.
- North Gwinnett Arts Association – Keith Nabb and Cherie Heringer reported the following updates:
  - Tables on the lawn for Jazz Fest 2019 are still available for purchase at \$300 per table.
  - Grant applications are still out.

- The Suwanee Skyline Soiree, held on April 13, 2019, was a success with 140 tickets sold and approximately \$10,000 raised for the organization.
- The NGAA hosted 18, sold-out, lantern-making workshops for this year's 'Glow in the Park.
- The Fine Arts Festival will be held on Saturday and Sunday, October 5 and 6, 2019.
