A. New Alcohol Beverage License for Venman Foods Inc., dba Cheeky Taqueria, 1039 Peachtree Industrial Boulevard

Praveen Vemanedi, Veman Foods, Inc., recently purchased Cheeky Taqueria and has applied for an alcohol beverage license for on premise consumption of beer, wine, and distilled spirits. The business, located at 1039 Peachtree Industrial Boulevard, previously held an alcohol license under the former owner. Praveen Vemanedi has applied to be the licensee and the Business Services Department recommends approval. This item will be on the <u>August 27th Council Public Hearing and Regular Agenda</u> unless Council prefers otherwise.

B. Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) Required Procurement Policy Adoption

To maintain eligibility for receiving federal funds, GDOT requires the city to adopt a procurement policy that meets their requirements for the procurement of engineering and design services for federally funded transportation projects. Consideration of this item will be on the <u>August 27th Council Regular Agenda</u> unless Council prefers otherwise.

C. Buford Highway Gateway

Clark Patterson Lee has started the process of producing design documents and has begun the permit review process. Permitting will be through Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT), instead of the Gwinnett Department of Transportation. which may result in a slightly slower permitting process. They have met with the GDOT reviewers and have addressed the first round of comments.

B. RZ-2024-001 – Owner: Sure, Inc. Natt Nwokolo. Applicant: Andy Sutton. Location: 15 Buford Highway

The applicant requests a rezoning from C-I (Neighborhood Commercial District) to OTCD (Old Town Commercial District) to allow for a mixed-use project containing residential and commercial uses. The site is located at the corner of Buford Highway and Cherokee Trail and contains approximately 1.54 acres. This item will be on the <u>August 27th Council Public Hearing and Regular Agenda</u> unless Council prefers otherwise.

C. Solar Power Contract with Cherry Street Energy

Staff wishes to discuss an agreement with Cherry Street Energy for the installation and maintenance of a solar power system at the Public Works building, 3625 Swiftwater Park Drive. This agreement would include an annual renewal and will serve as a hybrid to our existing electric usage with Georgia Power. E. Amendment to Adopted FY 2024-2025 Authorized Position Resolution

This change aims to ensure continuous service delivery and permits overlapping staffing during the transition period when one employee leaves and a new employee starts.
